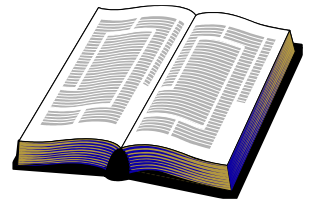

Jewish Prayer from the Inside**

Sh'ma and *Amidah* are the "signet ring of Jewish prayer" - but what do they mean? What's their deeper significance? What if I don't know Hebrew well (or at all)? Learn to understand the fundamentals of Jewish prayer from the inside.

Rabbi David Kay was ordained from the Jewish Theological Seminary in 2002, and has served Congregation Ohev Shalom since 2004. He had previously earned a degree in Ecology, Ethology, and Evolution from the University of Illinois. Rabbi Kay met his wife, Joanne, at Congregation Bene Shalom of the Deaf in Skokie, IL, and has been engaged in the Jewish Deaf community for over 20 years.
